- I. Want to improve your lesson plans in the easiest, quickest way possible.
- II. Have permission from your employer to publish your lesson plan, or if you already control the copyright be willing to release some of your rights.
- III. License your rights for re-use.
- IV. Publish your lesson plans online where other teachers can find them.
- V. Find lesson plans and other Open Educational Resources that can make your stuff better (asynchronous collaboration). Ideally also talk to the people who authored what you find to collaborate.
- VI. Idea s#%.
- VII. Deliver a better lesson and publish your review. Now you have made it possible for any teacher to build off your work, improve their lessons and give you feedback so you can make your lessons better!
- VIII. Re-start the cycle from step 4.

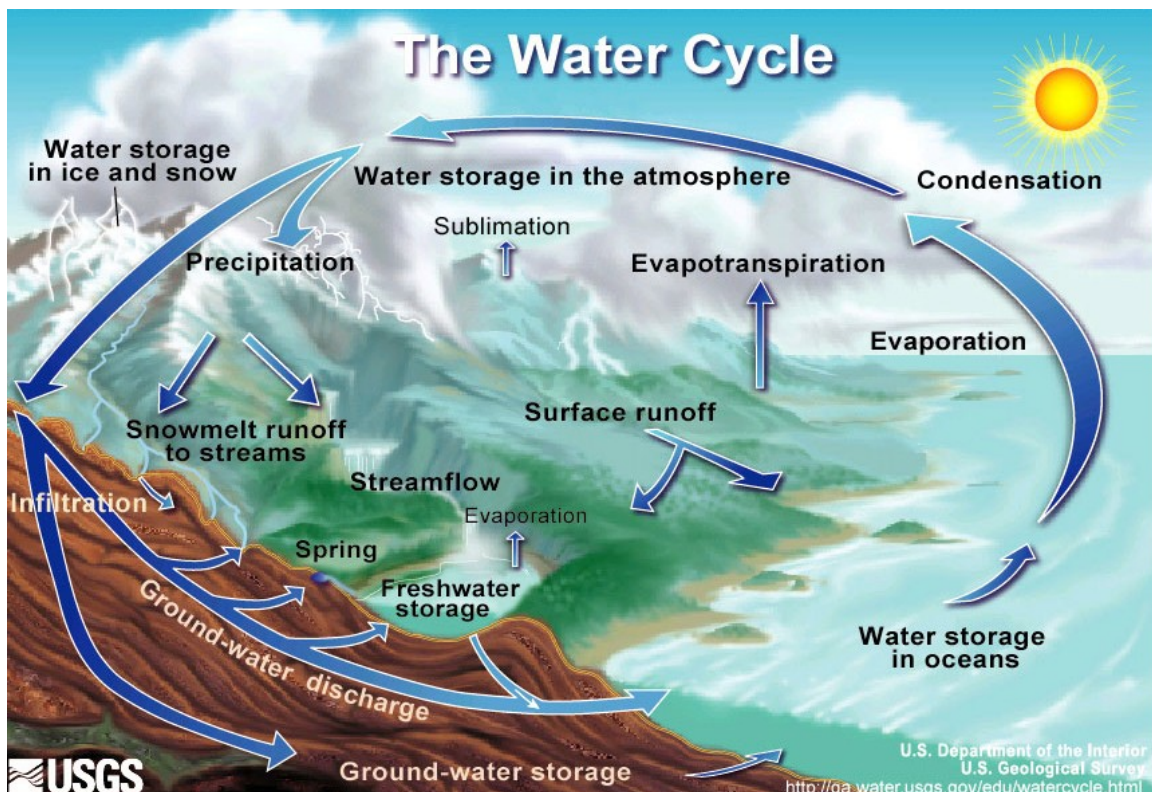
